
PREACHING: DAN

### From Thomas

Co-pastoring with Dan for the last 7 months has been a gift. Dan & my giftings seem to compliment each other well. It has been great to see Dan invest into the Manor with the experience he has gained from years of working with The Lighthouse in Canton. Coming out of the pandemic it has been great to have someone to collaborate with on various aspects of ministry. Whether it be funerals, sermon planning, visitations or other projects it has been good to have someone to bounce ideas off of and work together on. As we anticipate a season of discernment coming up regarding Ohio Conference and Mennonite Church USA it is an encouragement to me to know that I have a colleague to share the leadership mantle during this time. And of course, I enjoy the flexibility of being half time! This summer I am excited about being with Katrina a little longer on our vacation.

Thus far we have not run into any major co-pastoring conflicts or issues. One challenge is discerning when to work together on something and when to work individually. We are mindful that when we are working together on something the church's dollars are only going half as far--meaning if we are both at a two hour meeting, the church has paid for 4 hours of staff time for that meeting. Another challenge is coordinating schedules. We both have flexibility during the week so it takes communication to know who is going to be where and at what time.

Overall co-pastoring has been a blessing! I only wish this setup could have been established sooner, but I trust that God's timing is right and I'm grateful for the season of ministry we are in now. I'm also grateful that Crown Hill had the willingness to listen to God's leading and be open to this new model of pastoring.


### From Dan

In our combined fifty years of pastoral ministry, we have each learned the importance of being good listeners. And when we use that experience with each other, good things continue to happen.

Beyond this, to paraphrase a well-known proverb, co-pastors who pray together, stay together and work well together. Our weekly meetings include prayer for the congregation and each other. We depend on God's Holy Spirit providing counsel as we serve.
