Pastoral Note from Dan

When I'm traveling in a car or truck, most of the time I prefer to have my hands on the steering wheel. And when that's not possible, like on a long trip when I'm too tired to drive, I find it hard to be just a passenger. I'm wondering if this is a bit like it feels for someone who has lived long and is no longer able to take care of everything for themselves. Perhaps it just doesn't feel right to be forced to ask for help and rely on others.

I think I get that. And I've seen people respond in different ways. Some are so determined to keep their hands on the wheel that they become resentful toward people trying to be helpful. These folks need to be gently encouraged to let go.

Others have given up. They realize their "driving" days are over. In disappointment, they refuse to do what little they still could. These folks need to be gently encouraged to hang in there.

For those giving or receiving care, the 59 (give or take) "one anothers" in the Bible can help. The Holy Spirit knew we would need a guide. Here are just a few: "...love one another deeply, from the heart (1 Peter 3:8), encourage one another (1 Thess 4:18), and love one another as Jesus loved (John 13:34)."
