#### 1 Corinthians 12:4-6 & 12-20

4There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. 5There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. 6There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work. 12Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. 13For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. 14Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many. 15Now if the foot should say, “Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body,” it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. 16And if the ear should say, “Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body,” it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. 17If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? 18But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. 19If they were all one part, where would the body be? 20As it is, there are many parts, but one body.



This text came to mind this past week as on Sunday some of us had the opportunity to worship with the Congolese church in Akron. This was a great time of singing, eating and blessing each other. Then on Monday morning there was a Manor volunteer out in the rain grinding down stumps. This is what the Apostle Paul was getting at in this text. There are many, different gifts, but when those gifts are used in service to the church and to others, we bring glory to God.
